#### Introduction

Jeevodaya is a non-profit organization begun in the year 1999 with a passion of helping children who live alone, at and around Train stations, runaway and missing children by providing food, shelter and education. To make Itarsi a child friendly station in 1999 Sr. Clara, Sisters of St. Joseph of Chambéry started Jeevodaya Society. Over the past twenty years, Jeevodaya supported more than twelve thousand children (12,000) offering them a secure and dignified life, vocational training and job placement, by reuniting several with their families and rehabilitating a large number.

In the course of this twenty-year journey, Jeevodaya learned that, if these children are not helped at the right moment, they would end up begging on the streets, used for child labour, get involved in anti-social activities and trafficked for flesh trade. Moreover, they would lose the opportunity of enjoying

their childhood and would be denied developmental opportunities. Thus, Jeevodaya decided to work in ITARSI and started a temporary shelter home for children in need of care and protection in collaboration with West Central Railway Women's Welfare Organization. Jeevodaya also established long term shelters for girls and boys with the support of donors and congregations. Jeevodaya ensures these children are provided education, vocational training, care and affection up to the age of 18 and support of youth beyond 18, through vocational training and higher education.

In 2019, Jeevodaya celebrates its completion of a 20-year journey from the platforms of Itarsi railway station to providing quality, residential facilities for the rescue of children through Child Carrelnstitutions (CCI) and various other related programmes for the holistic rehabilitation of the children.

## Message from the Director

Dear Friends and Well-Wishers,

It is my pleasure to present to you, on behalf of the children and staff of the Jeevodaya Society, our Annual Report for 2018-19. It has a new look and presents information in accordance with the promise we made last year to focus more clearly on priorities and brining positive impact in the lives of children.

It has been another year of rendering service to children and youth, reached out 233 children through Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE intervention at the Itarsi Railway Junction. Establishment of Jeevodaya Child Assistance Booth 24x7 at Itarsi Railway Junction as per the Railway Standard operation procedure. (SOP, of Railway Board) was a land mark achievement in the history of Jeevodaya. Awareness sessions with 15 schools including, Railway school on topic of good and bad touch conducted and sensitized 1000 students.

Jeevodaya home management committee meetings are regular with support of Child welfare committee members and Govt. officials from Integrated child protection schemes under the Ministry of Women and Child development.

Children from Jeevodaya homes are doing well in studies and extra-curricular activities. One girl child participated in national level competitions - Hausla in New Delhi representing the Hoshangabad district, in November, 2018.

Staff training programs are always a platform for staff to enhance their skills, knowledge. Staff has attended various levels of training on child care-



counselling and network related meeting at the state level and national level. I thank our Asst. Director Joju Varghese for his initiative and motivation in staff capacity building and planning for organizational development.

We still have a long way to go and I hope that this report demonstrates Jeevodaya making good progress. I would like to thank, first of all, children & staff for responding so well, taking so much initiative themselves, and working extremely hard to meet goals and deadlines. I thank all Railway officials and Department of Women & Child Development, Donor agencies for the strong support and guidance. Similarly, I thank the leadership in the Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph, for their support and accessibility. And last but not least, thanks the many well - wishers, stakeholders, student volunteers supporting and helping us in journey of Jeevodaya.


#### Vision

Jeevodaya envisions building a just and conducive society where every child enjoys the basic rights of a healthy childhood, care and protection without any fear of subjugation or social exclusion.


#### **Mission**

## Jeevodaya's Journey in the last 20 years




## Programmes at a Glance

I. SAMYOG-Drop-in Centre and Outreach Program

SAMYOG is a drop-in Centre as well as a night shelter near Itarsi Railway Station. This centre works in collaboration with West Central Railway Women's Welfare Organisation begun in 2003. This centre works as a 24-hour open shelter for platform children and children of surrounding communities. Through this centre we provide Counselling, Bridge education, Medical Care etc. DIC also acts as a centre for various meetings and training programmes for the Team and Stakeholders like Railway Employees, Auto drivers, Taxi drivers etc.

## Children facilitated at DIC (April 2018 - March 2019)


## Children welcomed at Drop-In Centre (April 2018 - March 2019)



#### I. Chirag – Home for Girls


Since there was tremendous need of a shelter for girls rescued from the Railway Station and from other sources, Chirag was founded in 2006, to respond to this need. During the period, April 2018 to March 2019, a total of 102 children were supported and facilitated at Chirag. Here, the children are provided shelter, food, medical assistance and counselling. If the children are placed in homes for a long period of time, Individual Care Plans are drawn up and accordingly, relevant support provided. Enrolment in school and counselling support are provided for all children.

Currently there are 28 children, of various age groups from 06 to 18 years, residing at Chirag, All these children are enrolled in school and attend classes on a regular basis. They are given computer education, based on the prepared syllabus and certificates are issued at the completion of the course.



#### I. SPARC - Home for Boys

Sparc, founded in 2001, is a residential facility for rescued boys, with a capacity of 35. During 2018-19, eighty-one(81) children from various sources were helped at Sparc and seventy-seven (77) children reunited with their families. Children, with long time orders from CWC, are enrolled in schools and provided further educational support.




#### I. Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE

Since January 2018, Jeevodaya is recognised by Childline India Foundation for the implementation of Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) at Itarsi Station through Railway CHILDLINE service. It is a new Project for Jeevodaya, jointly initiated by Ministry of Women & Child Development and Indian Railways. The objective of the project is to rescue children 24X7 from the




Railway station, as per Railway SOP guidelines, and reintegrate them in Society, collecting information and presenting the same before the Child Welfare Committee, according to Juvenile Justice Act 2015.

During the period, 2018-19, two hundred and eleven (211) children (Data Report) were rescued and supported by the Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE team.



Throughout the year, Jeevodaya CHILDLINE team participates in various State, District Level Workshops and Advocacy meetings on Child Protection. Along with other stakeholders at Itarsi Railway Station; the team is proactive in various awareness programmes on Child Protection and Child-friendly Railway station.

# Major events and Programs April 2018-March 2019

#### 1. Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE Inauguration:

29th Sept.2018 Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE marked, as another milestone of Jeevodaya Society's Journey, the inauguration of Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE, by Dr. Shilasaran Sharma MLA, in the presence of Shri Udhay Pratap Singh, MP, Mr. R.S. Rajput, Director Rev.Sr. Clara and Railway officials, ICPS, CWC officials of Hoshangabad district and Jeevodaya Staff. This collaboration with the CHILDLINE is recognition of Jeevodaya for having completed 20 years of heroic service on Itarsi Railway station for abandoned children, found on the platforms.

#### 2. CHILD Help Group meetings:

The Child Help Group meetings, were conducted three times, in April 2018, January 2019, August 2019 by Itarsi Railway Junction, WCR. The CHILDLINE team, Jeevodaya was invited by Station Superintendent for an open discussion on care and protection of those children who stayon the platforms in vulnerable conditions. As was planned, the Announcement of 1098 Help line and Child Help Desk was done by Railway Authorities and Child Help group meeting and would be conducted at every quarter in accordance with the Railway Standard Operating Procedures for children in contact with Railways.

#### 3. Child Rights and Child Protection Training in Schools:

Every month, Jeevodaya CHILDLINE team organises Child Protection sessions at various schools around Itarsi. Details on Good touch and Bad Touch and various other child protection issues are covered in these sessions with children.

#### Jeevodaya :

Induction training for Staff was held in a systematic way from 10-12 September, 2018.

## 5. Purchase of a mini Van on 24th September, 2018:

Jeevodaya has, with the support of various donors, purchased a minivan for project support and official purposes.

### 6. WASH Champions Programme:

WASH stands for "Water and Sanitation Hygiene" an initiative of UNICEF on SDG 6 (Sustainable Development Goals)mentions clean water and sanitation. Apart from safe drinking water, there is also a necessity for hygiene and sanitation.

#### 7. Rescue of a 16-month-old girl child:

A16-month old baby girl was rescued from Platform No. 1, Itarsi Railway Station and the baby was sent, for twenty days, to the crèche. However, later on, the baby was handed over to her father. Now she lives with her father at Itarsi Railway Station. Two girls were rescued from Platform No. 6, Itarsi Railway Station by GRP. Currently, they live on Platform No. 6 with their families.

#### 8. Training on JJ Act:

Jeevodaya Childline team attended Juvenile Justice Act session along with CWC members, at Jeevodaya Hall. This JJ Session was organized by Jeevodaya as part of in-service training and capacity-building programmes.

#### 9. 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Day celebration of Jeevodaya:

On 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2018, Jeevodaya celebrated its 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Day, with residents, older children, youth, Government Stakeholders, Guests, Well - Wishers and Staff. The Theme of the Annual Day celebration was: Colours of Life. Children performed cultural activities based on the theme and showed how Jeevodaya is instrumental in bringing colour into their lives. Mr. Puneet Jeph, Sr.DEE office was the Chief Guest and. Mr. Steve Kenen from the Netherlands was the Special Guest. Rev. Sr. Clara, Jeevodaya Founder & Director, thanked each one who helped support Jeevodaya in various ways.

## 10. Child participation on National level Inter-child Care Institution competition – Hausla at New Delhi:

The Four-Day carnival- HAUSLA-2018 - for Children from Child Care Institutions (CCIs) by the Ministry of WCD, was organized at New Delhi in the month of November, 2018 The National Festival for Children witnessed the participation of more than 600 Children drawn from CCIs of 18 States, in various competitive events like painting, athletics, football, chess, speech, writing. The objective of the event was to provide a national platform for children from CCIs across India to showcase their talents, to make them aware of their hidden talents and to help use them to the maximum. One of our children from Jeevodaya Girls home participated in this Hausla competition.

#### 11. CHILDLINE se Dosti campaign:

Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE celebrated CHILDLINE Se Dosti Campaign on Universal Child Rights Day, 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 at Itarsi Railway station. The children from Jeevodaya Children home together with Staff were part of the campaign. The team provided awareness on Child Rights to Government Stakeholders such as Railway Station Superintendent, Deputy Station Superintendent, Inspector-RPF, Inspector-GRP, Army-Military officials, Itarsi local police station and Non-Govt. Stakeholders like coolies, vendors, shopkeepers, youth and railway passengers from Itarsi railway station. It was one of the major sensitisation programmes held with the support of children, staff and stakeholders.

#### 12. Enrolment of new children in School:

During this period, five new children (2 boys and 3 girls) from Jeevodaya homes were enrolled and introduced to school education; they continue to attend class regularly.

#### 13. New Year resolution and Kalmeshar one-day outing:

Jeevodaya Children made special resolutions on the eve of New Year. Each child came up with a resolution with short- term goals for the year 2019-20. On 1st of January, 2019 Jeevodaya home staff and children had an outing to nearby Kalmeshar.

## Case studies

#### Case Study: 1

Nitin (Name Changed) was from northern part of Madhya Pradesh, where his mother and his younger brother are now living. His father passed away when he was very young. His mother works on a farm belonging to another and his brother studies in a school. Nitin has passed Grade 10 and moved, along with friends, on 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2018, to Bhopal to work and supplement the family income.

On 6<sup>th</sup> January, Nitin was rescued by Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE, at Itarsi railway station while selling food on the train. He was presented at Child Welfare Committee Hoshangabad which decided to keep him at Jeevodaya Boys' Home for at least three months, for care and protection.

At Sparc, he was given counselling and provided quality care by the house-parents. As per his interest, he was given story books to read. Earlier he had said that he did not want to continue his education, as he wanted to earn money to support his family. But after observing the school-going children, and having spent much time in the library, he realised there is no substitute for education.

He discussed this with the social worker requesting to continue his education through short term courses from which he would learn something useful for his survival till he completed the age of 18. His memory is so sharp that he still remembers his 10 Board Roll number which helped us to download his mark sheet from the website www.mpsos.nic.in. With the help of the address mentioned on the mark sheet, Child Welfare Committee was convinced by the Social Worker that he be transferred to his home district, Rewa, where he could meet his mother and brother. Child welfare Committee Hoshangabad, released his transfer order.

He is aware that he will soon be transferred to his home district. Nowadays, he spends quality time reading books and playing cricket with the children. He remarked that at Jeevodaya Boy's home, it was the first time he got such quality care and growth facilities.
